The Certified Energy Manager (CEM) Credential Recognized Around the World

Since 1981 the Association of Energy Engineers (AEE) has been the leading credentialing body for “Energy Managers”. The CEM is the first recognized program under the [Better Buildings Workforce Guidelines](#) and is accredited by ANSI, the American National Standards Institute. The Better Buildings Workforce Guidelines were developed in collaboration between the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and the commercial energy performance industry to strengthen the growing energy efficiency market by certifying a highly skilled workforce.
